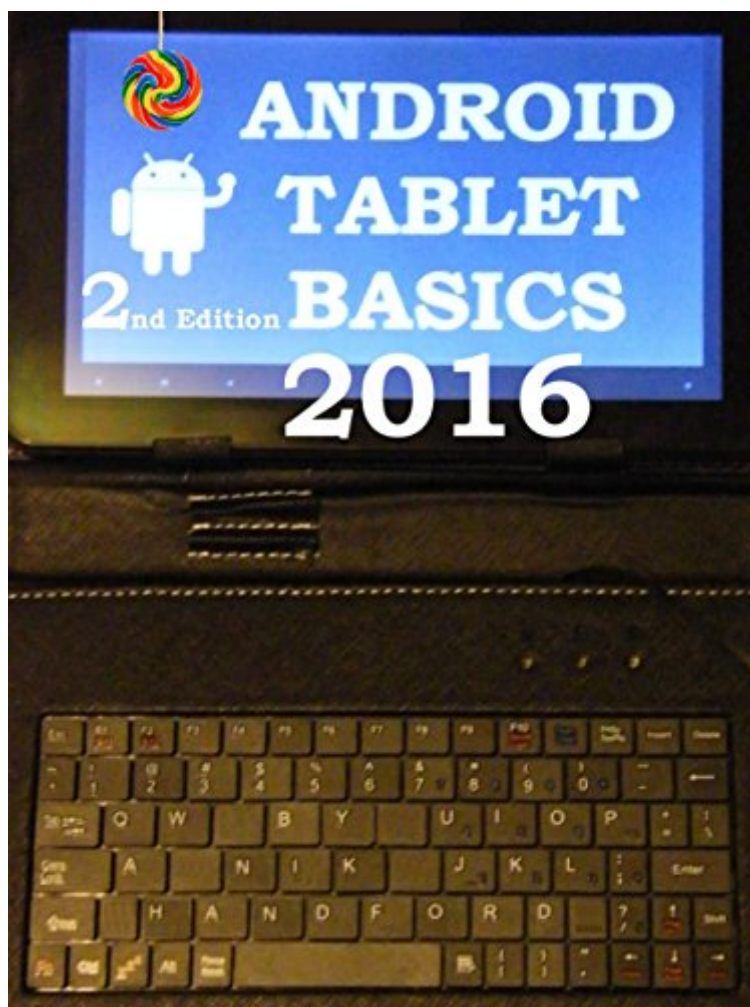

The changes Lollipop has brought and how to fix many of the problems. Content is out of date.Screen shots are amateur & blurry. Too bad the author didn't use a recent tablet to take the pictures.Save your money.Instead, I would recommend "Samsung Galaxy Tabs for Dummies" by Dan Gookin is a much more engaging book that covers more features more completely and is a handy reference, even if you're not a "dummy."
